
Stakeholder Feedback Analysis Report 2021-22

A total of 748 students gave their feedback. The analysis of feedback is given below




Analysis of Structured Feedback From Teachers 2019-20

A total of 79 Teachers gave their feedback. The analysis of feedback is given below




Analysis of Structured Feedback From Employers 2021-22

- A10. Curriculum promotes enough room for Industry-academia collaboration






Analysis of Structured Feedback From Alumni 2022

DEPARTMENT OF ARABIC ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK 2021-2022

The students suggested introducing Internship Programme for PG students, So it is resolved to approve following Translation Hubs for their Internship Programme. MIMS Hospital, Kottakkal, MIMS Hospital, Calicut, Maithra Hospital, Calicut, Baby Memorial Hospital, Calicut, Ayur Garden Hospital, Kottakkal, Research Department of Arabic, Calicut University. The feedback from students and alumni suggested to conduct Short Term Programms to improve student's language skills and to ensure their employability. So, the following Short Term Programmes are assigned by the faculties of department. A package of Gulf Arabic by Dr. Haseena Beegum Thattarassery, Effective Techniques of Learning Arabic Structure by Hamzathali. AP, Development of Criticism in Modern Arabic Literature by Dr. Masoor Ameen K, ICT in Arabic by Basheer. PT, Migration in Arabic Literature by Dr. Firdous Mon and Arabic Grammar for Competitive Examinations by Dr. Shameer Babu E K.

DEPARTMENT ECONOMICS ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK 2021-2022

The students suggested continuing the short term course "Economy and Polity for Competitive Examinations" to prepare for competitive exams, to study their subjects well and get a deep understanding of the curriculum. The feedback from alumni suggested adding such programmes will help them to excel in the academics and also this kind of practice gives them the ability to approach the topic from different ways and enhances their analytical skills. Teachers and employers commended Appearing for competitive exams require a lot of preparations, this kind of programmes improves knowledge and skills, which helps in boosting their confidence.

DEPARTMENT ENGLISH ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK 2021-2022

Feedback also became instrumental in the commencement of the Certificate programmes in the year 2021-22. The suggestion from the parents were to bring in Language skill-oriented courses. Thus, in the academic year 2021-22, department started a certificate programme called: Integrated Skills in English Communication, which offers practice in Listening, Speaking, Reading, and Writing. The syllabi of the Certificate Programme to be started in the following year was placed for discussion in the Board of Studies of May 2021.

DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK 2021-2022

Feedback also became instrumental in the commencement of the Certificate programmes in the year 2021-22. Resolved to implement Elective Course-1- HIS6 B16-History of Archaeology in India. to enhance the employability of the Programme. The suggestion from the parents was to offer some additional certificate courses to enable the students to attend competitive examinations. Thus, in the academic year 2021-22, the department startedcertificate programmes;

- 1. Kerala History for Competitive Exams, Duration: 30 Hours
- 2. Unity in Diversity: The Story of Indo-Islamic Architecture- Duration: 30 Hours
- 3. History of Kerala Renaissance- Duration: 30 Hours

DEPARTMENT OF MASS COMMUNICATION AND JOURNALISM ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK 2021-2022

The students suggested starting a new short term courses for developing subjects knowledge well and get a deep understanding of the curriculum. The feedback from alumni suggested adding such programmes will help them to excel in the academics and also this kind of practice gives them the ability to approach the topic from different ways and enhances their analytical skills. Teachers and employers commended that appearing for competitive exams require a lot of preparations, these kinds of programmes improve knowledge and skills, which helps in boosting their confidence.

DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK 2021-2022

Teachers recommended blended class rooms with usage of recorded videos and learning management softwires for effective learning even after beginning of offline classes. Parents and alumni members suggested more advanced and application level instructional strategies. Experts from industries recommended inclusion of internships in industry /research institute to increase the employability of students and they suggested signing of MOU's with industries for the same.

DEPARTMENT OF FOOD TECHNOLOGY FEEDBACK ANALYSIS 2021-2022

Teachers suggested observing all the days associated with the national and global food science and nutrition related days under the department of Food Technology as the Dept. offers Food Tech and Nutrition programmes. Teachers also suggested to strengthen the internal poject work of NSD Programme. As per the feedback from Students of Nutrition, strengthened the facilities in lab and decided to avail the Pilot plant facility for their processing preticals. It is recorded from the students feedback that it will be better if an assignment of 'one student one product' project for enriching the skills and capacities of the students.

DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK 2021-2022

The employer recommended to execute the internship programme to the PG students as part of their PG project with extra credit. It is suggested to promote the proposal for an internship

Programme to ensure maximum employability. Students suggested to approve the liberalised question paper during covid-19 pandemic period. Teachers suggested to revise the PG and UG syllabus by adding some novel sessions. Alumni suggested to execute some more certificate course in the area MS office, Statistics and abstract Algebra. Employers stressed the importance of communication skill among the graduates.

DEPARTMENT PHYSICS ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK 2021-2022

In response to the feedback from teaches, department implemented three certificate courses titled "Law of attraction –The physics behind thought philosophy", "The physics of Sports" and "Nanoscience and technology". Parents suggested adding some fundamental concepts from mathematical physics to the first semester core course "Mechanics 1" so that the students can understand the theory quickly. The suggestion was discussed the BoS meeting and recommended for the approval of Academic council.

DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK 2021-2022

In teacher feedback, practical's specific to each subject were emphasized. In order to enhance students' employability and entrepreneurial skills, stakeholders suggested adding relevant and novel topics. Experts and teachers recommended updating the syllabus and collaborating with partner universities on courses. To improve the job opportunities for Zoology students, the Government of India's new initiative "Green skill Developmental Programme" was suggested for consideration. Internship programme was also part of the curriculum for all post graduate students.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK 2021-2022

Feedback also became essential for the commencement of the Certificate programmes. The feedback from different stakeholders suggested adding relevant and novel courses to enhance the employability and entrepreneurial skill of the students. B.com and BBA Students suggestedhaving more industrial connect and updates. Students also suggested that more recent updates added in the add on courses. Members shared various Inputs to change in the pattern at external examination question papers and valuation system during covid-19 and board decided to implement changes according to the changes made by the University of Calicut. It is also decided to continue the same changes in all other examination during Covid-19. A discussion was also held on certificate course during this academic year.
