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Project Quality Cell (PQC)

After conferring autonomous status, all the Boards of Studies took a decision on mandatory project work for all UG programmes. The College Project Quality Cell is constituted by IQAC to improve the quality of UG and PG Projects with Principal as chairman, a teacher coordinator and one faculty from each department as members. The student internship and industrial visits are also monitored by PQC.

As a follow up to the discussions held in the College Council and the Governing Council, Project quality cell has been constituted in the academic year 2017-18. The purpose of Quality Cell is to implementation of time line for the preparation and submission of the UG & PG projects. This is part of the institutional effort to improve the quality of the UG and PG projects. These measures also make sure that the projects are submitted on time and that the students are aware of the seriousness of their efforts. Students' projects are checked for plagiarism too. College also takes initiative to use statistical software to do analysis of project work.

Awareness workshops for students and Supervisors



Such product attributes motivate consumers to purchase luxury products and give them satisfaction by purchasing them. The market for fashion products have become diverse with entries of international brands in India. The arrival of luxury brands and strong fashion advertisements etc. motivate consumers to buy luxury The history of Indian luxury is as old as the history of our nation. The opulent world of Maharajas and their splendor and magnificent vision had always been and attraction for the largest European Luxury Houses. The list include the renowned Cartier Baroda diamond Necklace, the S.T DuPont lighter and the 1000 Carat Patiala Necklace. But for many years, the consumption of luxury was limited by the ruling classes only. In India in the early 1980s consumption was limited to essential goods only due to low purchasing power of consumers. As a result of globalization and the growth of the Indian economy, consumers have been led to purchase luxury products. The Indian luxury market is expected to grow by 10% over the next 5 years. The Covid-19 pandemic has caused two years of extreme volatility for luxury brands, but the sector is emerging from the crisis with greater strength, resilience and adaptability than before. The Covid-19

problem in 2020 has had a significant influence on the luxury goods

3 market. The changes bought by Covid-19 increased the presence of online in every aspect of life. According to the Deloitte report, five Indian brands are among the top 100 worldwide powers of luxury goods the Titan company Limited had a 22nd rank, Kalyan jewellers India Pvt. Limited had a 37th rank, Joyalukkas India Pvt. Limited had a 46th rank, PC Jewellers Limited had a 57thr rank and Tribhovandas Bhimji Zaveri Limited had a 92nd rank.




