DEAD POET'S SOCIETY: ONLINE PLATFORM FOR BOOK REVIEWS






2. ALCHEMY OF LIFE: RUMI'S POETRY

Resource Person: Fida






5. READING THE MEMORY POLICE




6. READING ANNE FRANK'S DIARY OF A YOUNG GIRL
