
1. HOW TO TEACH TRANSACTIONS: ESSENTIAL ENGLISH LANGUAGE SKILL


One Day Workshop




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8. Social Stigma and New Life: How Human Values should be Held Together During a Pandemic

Day 1

In early stages of Indian Film history, Mahabharatha and Ramayana were of primary inspirations from mythology. Later on, directors began to use mythological films for propagating political agendas. The trend continues even today. The audience should be very cautious while watching mythical/religious movies, as it will be agenda oriented most often.
