15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The institution promotes multi-interdisciplinary knowledge as it is indispensable for the holistic development of students, to make them more employable with knowledge and to provide ample possibility for research. All undergraduate programmes since 2009 follow the Choice Based Credit and Semester System. The institution provides academic flexibility to move from one discipline to the other at UG level by providing two elective subjects, one in the 5th semester, and the other in the 6th semester. All departments offer one elective paper called open course in the 5th semester, which is open for all students except for students of the same department. The Common courses of all UG programmes (English) are interdisciplinary in nature with extracts and selections dealing with Indian Constitution, Secularism, Human Rights, and Gender Issues. The complementary courses of all UG programmes are inter-disciplinary, allied closely to the core courses. Food Technology has interdisciplinary subjects such as Operation Research, Bio Statistics, Bio Chemistry, Micro Biology and Food Engineering. Commerce and Management studies are interdisciplinary. All departments offer short term programmes which is in tune with the inter-multidisciplinary approach adopted by the college. The courses are primarily offered by departments for students from other departments. MESMAC, the annual international interdisciplinary conference is another effort at globalizing the academic context.

17. Skill development:

College has many programmes which are meant to develop the skills of students. SKY (Skill To Youth) is a skill development programme implemented in association with Centre for Information and Guidance India (CIGI), Calicut. The purpose is to bridge students' lack of proficiency in English language communication skill, and to enhance their interpersonal and computer skill which are essential for gaining good job. SKY provides proper guidance and counselling to enable students to plan their career; It Nurtures students with life skills and leadership quality.

ASAP is implemented at the College in association with Department of

Collegiate Education, Govt. of Kerala. ASAP was formed to alleviate the problem of unemployment among the educated Kerala Youth, due to inadequate linguistic and other soft skills. Enhancing the employability of Kerala Youth by strengthening skills is the objective of ASAP.

Innovation Council is another initiative for developing the skills of students. The main objective of innovation council is to infuse creative ideas and innovative talents among the students of our college. Entrepreneurship Development Club plays a vital role in the development of entrepreneurs in the college. ED Club has conducted a lot of programmes for encouraging the initiative power among the students in the institution. College runs finishing school programme for outgoing students for skill development.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Our institution takes measures for the integration of Indian Knowledge system as part of the curriculum. College has Department of Hindi. Hindi is offered for students as second language for BA/B Sc/B Com Students. Students who prefer Hindi as second language can opt it. The syllabi of Hindi for graduate students include courses like 'Prose and Drama' (I Semester) , 'Grammar, Correspondence and Translation' (II Semester), 'Poetry in Hindi' (III Semester), Novel and Short Stories (IV Semester) which includes literary works which reflects Indian culture, and Indian Knowledge system. English Common Courses are prescribed for BA/BSc Students up to fourth Semester. The text books include stories and essays of Indian writers, which tells about Indian social and political scenario. Apart from Hindi and English, Malayalam is another language taught to graduate students. Malayalam literature also prescribes literary texts which integrates Indian Knowledge system. As per the demand of the topics, bi-lingual mode of teaching is employed by the faculty, which includes English and the vernacular language. Measures to integrate Indian Culture and Traditions, Indian Artistic Tradition, Ancient Indian Traditional Knowledge are taken by the institution through cultural programmes and through the curriculum. The army and naval wing of National Cadets Corps maintains the sense of nationalism in the campus.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

POs, PSOs and Cos are designed to ensure complete and comprehensive learning about the program and courses as these are critical for the successful career of the student.

College has conducted Workshops on Outcome Based Education and OBE Mapping. The Programme Outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) and Course Outcomes (COs) for all UG and PG programmes were developed in 2019. The COs were designed with the following criteria : The course outcomes identify the minimum achievement required for success in the course. They are based on the principles of Blooms taxonomy including Knowledge, Comprehension Application, Analysis, Synthesis and Evaluation.

For each programme, PO/PSO and CO are designed through the following process steps:

1) Head of department (HOD) consulted faculty and prepared the draft version of the PSO and POs with the help of the faculty, which are in line with Graduate Attributes and Vision, Mission of the College and the department.

2) Views of alumni, employers are taken by head and teachers. HOD and department faculty analysed and expressed their opinion on the revised PSOs and POs.

3) The process was continuously monitored by Outcome Based Education Committee and finally were approved by IQAC

1.1.1 - Curricula developed and implemented have relevance to the local, national, regional and global developmental needs which are reflected in Programme Outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) and Course Outcomes (COs) of the various Programmes offered by the Institution.

The role of MES Mampad College in providing the human resources to the state, nation and to the world has always been unique. We have meticulously designed our syllabus to meet the local/regional/national and global developmental needs, which is in tune with the vision and mission of the institution. Curriculum is framed considering the recent developments in the subjects concerned, after discussing it with academic peers, with inputs

from industry, the alumni and other stake holders of education.

As part of restructuring of curriculum of Under-Graduate programmes, the University had introduced CBCSS from the academic year 2009-10. Conferring of autonomous status in 2015, with the liberty to design curriculum, enabled us to hone our syllabus by offering programmes based on needs of industry and society. Today we have 27 programmes in total, which consists of 14 UG, 4 BVoc, 8 PG and 1 Integrated PG programme. Every new courses started are designed so as to sensitize the students on areas like National Development, Sustainability and Gender.

Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values and Environment and

Sustainability are highly valued by MES Mampad College since they are closely linked to objectives and core values that we are endeavouring to impart to our stakeholders. Accordingly, these are consciously integrated into the College's day-to-day administration, approved curricula, value-added courses and co-curricular activities. It caters to the needs of society and has relevance to the regional as well as national developmental requirements through a concerted effort of all the departments, clubs and cells.

From 2019 admission onwards all UG programmes include Audit Courses. There shall be one Audit course each in the first four semesters. The first semester includes Environmental Studies, which imparts Environmental Consciousness in students. The second semester Audit course is Disaster Management. Human Rights and Gender Studies are taught in third and fourth semesters respectively.

Programmes like BCom, BBA, BA Arabic, BA History, BA Mass communication, Malayalam Literature, BSc Chemistry etc incorporates into their syllabus's issues relevant to Professional Ethics ,Gender, Human Values ,Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum.
