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





NSS Unit collaborated with Mahatma Gandhi National Council for Rural Education (MGNCRE), Government of India, set up a helpline desk 'KOODE' for all type of queries and support related to Covid 19. The programme was inaugurated by M.P. Anil Kumar MLA. Principal of MES Mampad College, Anas. E welcomed the gathering. The NSS volunteers were trained to work for the helpline desk. All volunteers actively entailed their job giving guidelines regarding vaccination centers, oxygen availability in hospitals, food availability for the quarantined patients, counselling for the patients. The helpline desk had 15 volunteers at a time and there were two shifts. The

volunteers were engaged into different teams- hospital management, non-hospital management, family and emotional support, medical supplies and psycho social support team. Details about each caller were entered into the Google spreadsheet that can be accessed by the whole team simultaneously and Officials of the health department in the district. As the number of fresh Covid 19 cases and calls had increased, the NSS programme officers of MES Mampad College, Anasbabu , had decided to add 15 more trained volunteers on a temporary basis to the team. The whole programme was coordinated by Ashif and Ameera, students of MES Mampad College.





Background and relevance of the webinar:

The main intension behind the webinar organized in cooperation with 'Integrated Child Development Service' and NSS units of MES Mampad college, Sahya Arts & Science college Wandoor, Ambedkar Arts & Science College, Wandoor was to lay out the key points on the Anemia .The necessity of organizing such a programme was to rise the knowledge on anemia, to be aware about anemic condition, to take precautions and more care to avoid such a condition. Webinar mainly discussed following points:

- Anemia in children
- Types of anemia
- Risk factors of anemia
- Symptoms of anemia
- Diagnosis of anemia in a child

The webinar:

The webinar was entitled "Anemia campaign" which started on 19 June 2021 at 2.00 pm via Google meet. The programme was organized in Collaboration with 'Integrated Child Development Service 'and NSS units of MES college <ampad, Sahya Arts & Science College Wandoor, Ambedkar arts & science college Wandoor. An Nss volunteer named Ashif T introduced the speaker of program and welcomed all to the webinar .Then the program was inaugurated by Child Development Project Officer Jayageetha. She gave brief idea about anemia. The program was coordinated by Ashif Zain in presence of Nss program officers Anas babu and Sameer Khan.

Rubeena K K, Nutritionist at ICDS Wandoor give detailed lecture on anemia. Webinar began with a question what is anemia in children?

Anemia is a common problem in children. About 20% of children in the U.S. is diagnosed with anemia at some point. A child who has anemia does not have enough red blood cells or hemoglobin. Hemoglobin is a type of protein that allows red blood cells to carry oxygen to other cells in the body. There are many types of anemia.

- Iron deficiency anemia. This is not enough iron in the blood. Iron is needed to form hemoglobin. This is the most common cause of anemia.
- Megaloblastic anemia. This is when red blood cells are too large from a lack of folic acid or vitamin B-12. One type of megaloblastic anemia is pernicious anemia. In this type, there is a problem absorbing vitamin B-12, important to make red blood cells.

The symptoms of anemia may look like other blood problems or health conditions. Anemia is:

- Often a symptom of another disease. Be sure to report any symptoms to your child's doctor.
- Always see your child's doctor for a diagnosis.

Then some of volunteers asked their doubts and it cleared through simple words and example .The virtual program was highly informative. About 100 students participated .It was came to an end by the vote of thanks by Salih Rahman, Nss volunteer of MES Mampad college.

Purpose of the program:

The aim of the programme was to collect fund for the house construction of a poor physically challenged woman namely Ayisha, who stays at Kottampaara, Wandoor. She was provided with a small amount for house by the Panchayath scheme, but the construction process has been stopped for 2 years due to financial constraints. NSS unit of Mampad college made a study on the case and found it is hundred percent genuine. Hence volunteers and conveners together decided to conduct a fund collection drive for the remaining construction works of Ayisha's house.

Steps of fund collection:


A campaign 'Othiri Thanal' was initiated on 17th June 2021 after several discussions. NSS Programme Officer, Anas babu talked to students through G Meet on current situation of the house construction and he told the students to adapt online ways at most for the fund collection considering the pandemic situation. The whole 100 volunteers were divided into 10 groups with a leader for each groups. The volunteers were asked to collect money and to update in respective groups and at the end, final sum collected by each group was updated in the main group of NSS. In fact, the minute to minute update in the groups turned the fund collection to a competition among students.

Team 2, team 4, and team 10 collected 1st, 2nd and 3rd top amount respectively and while considering individual contribution, it was 'Thwaha' from team 4 at the top who collected 2420/rupees.

Even in this Covid situation, volunteers collected 32112.5 ₹ rupees totally and the amount was later transferred to Ayisha's bank account.






YOGA-The Need of the Hour (A Talk on the Importance of Yoga)

The Webinar:



Aslam Siddiq, clinical psychologist at Almas hospital, Kottakkal, spoke about the mental health disorders come across students in this pandemic and gave tips to overcome from that disorders. The webinar provided understanding if, and how, the pandemic has contributed to mental health difficulties for students is a priority as the pandemic continues to impact many facets of everyday life. There are good reasons to believe that a global pandemic will influence suicide risk. Specifically, the need for physical distancing may increase a sense of social isolation. The webinar provided solutions to prevent suicide tendencies among youth, intervention and posttension strategies.

The COVID-19 pandemic is creating significant stress and uncertainty-not only for children and students, but also for those charged with caring for those students at home and in educational mental health contexts. Having an understanding of what can put individuals at higher risk for traumatic stress, as well as those strategies that are helpful in mediating this stress can empower leaders to support themselves and others.

The virtual programme got enthusiastic response and appreciation from students. More than 70 students attended the event.it was concluded by the vote of thanks by Ashif Zain, Unit Secretary.

11. Hiroshima Day observation – August 06, 2021



1- Poster Making Competition




2- Placard Making




NSS Day Special Address:



stant mobile usage. The ophthalmologist observed that 90% of eye problems of the youth are due to excessive usage of mobile phones.






28. Inauguration of Vimukthi Club & Awareness Class






30 December 2021
